**All Saints Day**

**Nov. 1, 2009**

Rv 7:2-4, 9-14; Ps 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6; 1 Jn 3:1-3; Mt 5:1-12

In the midst of their tribulations on earth, the servants of God sing a jubilant song of heaven. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, the victory of the faithful has been assured. "Salvation is from our God!" A vast throng rejoices – 12 x 12 x 1,000 – the totality of God's servants from every nation, race, tribe, and tongue.

In the Beatitudes, Jesus described the suffering of the present life: poverty, hunger, thirst, oppression, persecution. He also showed us the glory of the life to come: consolation, satisfaction, mercy. Who is worthy to ascend the mountain of the Lord? Those whose white baptismal garments have been immersed in the blood of the Lamb. Those whose hands are sinless and whose hearts are clean. All who obtain these Christ-like characteristics have achieved the fulfillment for which they were created. Though it may seem an impossible goal, what God has intended for us will come to light in the beatific vision. Then we will discover our true image in the face of God. "Be glad and rejoice!" Our reward is nothing less than the reign of God!

**For reflection:** Does my behavior toward others demonstrate my life in Christ? Which beatitude do I need to put into practice today?

**All Souls**

**Nov. 2, 2009**

Wis 3:1-9; Ps 27:1,4,7,8,9, 13-14; Rom 5:5-11; Jn 6:37-40

From the moment of our birth, we begin to die. To unbelievers, those who have died cease to exist, but they are actually at peace with God. It may seem that people are punished by the trials they suffer, but the hardship they suffer in life is a process of purification, a preparation for receiving great good from God.

Paul exclaimed his confidence in God's power to save. Through Jesus' death and resurrection we are ushered into the very presence of God. What we find when that door opens is not condemnation or judgment but the undeserved loving-kindness of God that is poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.

Jesus invites us to come to him in our pain and our grief. He is God's servant who has shown us the way to God. No one will be lost on the journey. Everyone who believes in Christ will be raised up on the last day. Even as we draw our last breath, we will draw our life from the risen Christ.

**For reflection:** Do I contemplate my own death and new life in Christ? Whom do I need to comfort in their grief for a departed loved one?

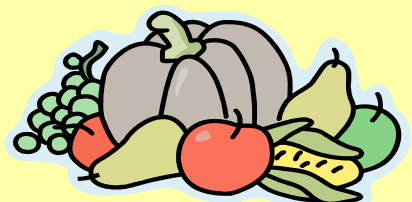




