## **FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day

### **Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time      February 14, 2010**

Jer 17:5-8; Ps 1:1-2,3,4,6; 1 Cor 15:12, 16-20; Lk 6:17, 20-26

Jeremiah's own people betrayed him and persecuted him for speaking God's word. The prophet knew that those who turned away from the Lord were like the dry and withered foliage in the desert, a wasteland with no water to nourish them. In contrast, those who were faithful to God's word were like trees with deep, well-watered roots. No matter what the changing season brought, in scarcity or abundance, they bore good fruit.

Paul was a messenger of hope and trust in Jesus's life-giving gospel. His faith in Jesus reached beyond the grave. If our hope is limited to this life, we are to be pitied, for we are the deadest of the dead. Jesus has been raised from the dead; he is the firstfruit of all who will one day reign with him.

Jesus tells us where we can find true happiness. The reign of God belongs to anyone who hungers and thirsts for it. Whoever suffers persecution for the sake of the truth will be filled with joy and eternal happiness.

**For reflection:** Do I find happiness in the things of the world or in living God's word? Who needs to hear a word of hope in my community?

Today begins the season of Lent, a period of 40 days we set aside for prayer and fasting, and doing good things for others. In this way we prepare for Easter, that greatest feast in the Church, when we celebrate Jesus' rising from the dead.



Every year on Ash Wednesday, all over the world, Catholics receive a cross of ashes on their foreheads. This is a sign of sorrow for sin. It is a public sign. It tells our friends and neighbors that we know we are not perfect. We sometimes do what is wrong. We break the law of God. We hurt other people. We act with selfishness. Today we tell God and each other that we are sorry for our sins. We are going to try, with God's help, to become better people. The cross of ashes we receive means all of these things.

return to me with all your heart,
